What do I mean by Drupal for non-developers?



This talk is **not** about learning to code, nor is it a crash course in learning Drupal basics.

It is about **why** a comprehensive understanding of Drupal and its capabilities is beneficial for all team members, not just developers.





Why is Drupal knowledge & experience for my non-developer team members be important?





Our project managers can confidently lead conversations with clients:

- \rightarrow Outline possible options & next steps.
- \rightarrow **Provide context** for decision-making and best practices.
- \rightarrow Build a strong case for Drupal as a platform for their needs.
- → Can be your **first level of triage** for easier CMS configurations.
- → **Empower clients** on how to make updates/edits themselves.

Growth

Team members can professionally develop while the company can confidently expand services:

- → Team members feel more connected and confident in their capabilities.
- → We have grown our capabilities and services by training non-developers in more Drupal-specific knowledge.
